On applying Yosemite Big Wall Techniques to the remote ranges of the World. By John Sherman.

If we'd wanted to fail on a wall, we couldn't have planned it better. Seven raps down chimneys got us to the base of the North Wall of Mt. Buffalo Gorge in Southeastern Australia. The haulbag on my back kept trying to flip me upside down, but luckily my \$8.88 K-mart lawnchair-portaledge would frequently jam in the chimneys and right me.

At the base we unloaded the haulbag to discover our first casualty. Fortunately there were 23 more beers where that came from, not to mention the cask of wine. Should be enough to last ten pitches. I was aware that we could knock off this liliputian excuse for a wall in a day, but Stumpy insisted he wanted a real Californian Big Wall Experience, hence the lawnchair, \$3.99 hammock, two tape bubbabox, 15 cassettes, spare batteries, refreshments. etc.


In fact, everything one could want on a wall, except a pulley.

I'd planned on a casual four pitch a day pace, which would stretch the beverage supplies a bit thin. Hey, we were out for adventure. We got it. Hauling the first two pitches took longer than leading them. Much longer. The third pitch was Stumpy's first aid lead. Halfway up he announced he was "real scared". Two placements later he declared, "I'm pooing." The next piece popped when tested and that was it for Stumpy's aid career. When I topped the third pitch, it was obvious we could never haul over the edge of the belay ledge so the decision was made to return to the ground and lighten the bag. In the dark. (Our spare tapedeck batteries wouldn't fit in the flashlight).

An enjoyable day was

spent deflating the haulbag and exhausting the batteries. The next day dawned wet, removing the option of climbing out. We saddled up and started the long rugged hike down the canyon. Hiking in the river itself proved easier and no wetter than bashing and falling through the face-high brackens on the banks. Four miserable hours of communing with the trout later, we finally sighted the trail. The hikers pointed at us in disbelief. I don't blame them. We were standing at the lip of a ninety foot waterfall with no choice but to head back up the steep-walled gorge.

Piton Craft

Piton craft is fast becomming a lost art. The subtle points of pounding on iron, though simple in principle, can be learned only through experience. Learning *not* to overdrive pins takes time. Cleaning your own leads is a good lesson. Many routes like the Zodiac and the Shield are succumbing to the heavy battering from the unskilled hammer.

Agood nailer is an agressive cleaner but is aware of rock distruction. Knocking a pin back & forth the full length it can travel is the most efficient method. To prevent dropping a piton, a "cleaner biner" attached to a sling is clipped in as the pin gets loose; pulling and applying leverage with the cleaner biner/sling aids in final removal.

Expanding flakes, once the nailer's nemisis, have been tamed with modern gear. Clever use of pitons, nuts, and camming units reduces expando from its voodoo reputation to a fairly sane activity. Still, however, cruxes of many modern nail-ups are often thin expanding flakes where a <u>feel</u> for the placement is necessary. Clipping into sucessive placements with a daisy is recommended with expando.

Stacking pins can be a rewarding challenge. Leeper Z-tons are commonly stacked with angles, but many combinations of pins can be stacked together. A tie-off threaded though the eyes of stacked pins prevents losing them. Often, a sawed off pin can more efficiently take the place of stacked pins.



Bolting Technique

Good drilling technique comes with practice. Experimenting with a variety of techniques and systems will naturally optimize your ability to place a good bolt. Here are the basics:

Location: Pick an area in smooth, solid rock, at least ten bolt diameters away from the nearest fracture or edge, considering at the same time the line of pull and convienience for clipping. Optimize the height of bolt with the ease of drilling, which is efficient a 2/3 of your maximum reach. Test for exfoliated or hollow sections with a hammer. The hanger must sit flush with the rock, so small nubbins should be chipped away. Beware, however, that excessive pounding will weaken the rock.

Starting and drilling the hole: To begin a hole, use the drill as a chisel, cross-hatching to create a shallow circular indentation.

The hole must be drilled perpendicular to the surface of the rock, so it is important to maintain a steady drilling angle; if the drill is allowed to wander, an oversize hole will result (unavoidable to some degree). Turn the drill at least 1/8 of a revoultion between every hammer blow, and distribute the total number of hits at each orientation evenly (with at least 180° total rotation).

As the hole progresses, grip the holder loosely maintaining a steady angle and constant rotation, and allow the drill to rebound slightly (1/4" or so) after each hit. The resulting pneumatic effect helps displace dust, which otherwise slows drilling and encourages binding. Periodically remove the drill and purge the dust. Rockdust can be convieniently extracted with a moist drill, twisted in the hole and removed.

If the bit binds in the hole, lightly tap on the holder as in normal drilling, and hope that the drill rebounds loose. Do not hammer side to side on a bound drill, as this will surely break it. Erratic hammering will also break a drill; sometimes even normal use will break one. The "unbreakable drill" is a myth, and a broken bit midway into a hole can be ultimately disheartening. After drilling to the desired depth, clean the hole well with a blow tube or a "puffer", a 3 oz. baby enema syringe available at drug stores.


Fast drilling technique is essential for on-lead bolting on small stances. Some on lead drilling tips: select a stance-no hands if possible-and quickly assume a balanced drilling position. Lowered heels will delay the onset of calf burn. Hooks can be used to unweight the rope, or for aid. Maintain a relaxed, steadfast attitude, and avoid procrastination: resting and frequently shifting position is inefficient. Difficult on-lead bolt placement is an uncelebrated art, its perfection requiring boldness and a desire for adventure.

Copperheading

Copperheading is an art, learned through experience. Done properly, the 4-step process illustrated below optimizes a placement. To clean heads, connect a sling from the copperhead to the hammer, and swing upwards, jerking them out (good etiquette calls for leaving them in place if it looks like the wire will rip out). Aluminum heads have the most malleable mashing properties, but copper is more durable. An adequate rack for the Sheild or the Zodiac would be 2#1's, 8#2's, 6#3's, 5#4's, and 3#5's. (#2's are the diameter of a cigarette. #4's and #5's are coined




"cowheads"). Note: though copperhead placements may stink, they never really smell bad.



Big-Wall Hauling Technique

Finishing a lead isn't all there is to finishing a pitch, for the haulbag's still gotta be hauled. Getting it off the previous anchor is the first task; cooperation between partners is required. Lowering it out is recommended if the pitch leans or overhangs. The illustrations above show some possible big-wall hauling techniques. Make sure to

securely clip the haulbag into each belay in at least two points: the haul-rope and the haul-bag daisy.

<u>Illustrations</u>

- **1. Leg-Hauling**: Ok with a light bag.
- 2. Body Hauling: Standard technique.

Note: longer length (up to full rope-length) body-hauls are possible. Usually way sporty.
